Rods And Mains Gone Awry

The job ticket called for rods and mains on a Detroit Series 60—typically a straightforward, sameday repair. The customer arrived at Pittsburgh Power expecting a routine bearing refresh: new connectingrod and main bearings, torque to spec, and back on the road. Once we pulled the oil pan, the scope changed. What looked routine was not.

During teardown, the crank gear was found to

have a large section of teeth missing. The bull gear was also damaged, and metal debris was present in the pan.

In an ideal world, extensive damage to both gears would point to a threequarter block replacement or a full geartrain overhaul, since adjacent components may also be compromised. Given schedule and budget constraints, we discussed risk, cost, and downtime with the owner and agreed

on a targeted plan: thoroughly clean the engine, replace the bull gear and crank gear, and proceed with the rods and mains as planned.

Can you change the crank gear without pulling the crank? On a Series 60, yes. The crankshaft timing gear is pressfit; with the correct puller and installer, it can be removed and installed accurately. This is a controlled, hydraulic, tooldriven process. The gear mounts at the front of the crank, drives the bull gear, and engages the oilpump

drive gear—details that matter when diagnosing the failure.

With the plan set, we disassembled to the level required for gear work. We flushed the internals with mineral spirits repeatedly until clean. After a gear failure, reassembly requires a contaminationfree environment; any remaining debris can damage journals, bearings, or pumps. We pressed on the new crank gear to specification, installed the new bull gear, torqued the rods and mains, verified clearances, and inspected all related components.

The truck arrived for a bearing refresh and left with a renewed front gear train. The owner received a solution that respected their constraints, and the engine is back in service. That leaves an important question: how can a crank gear and bull gear fail while the oil pump remained unaffected?

One plausible explanation is localized tooth overload between the crank gear and bull gear that did not involve the sector where the crank gear meshes with the oilpump drive gear. The Series 60's crank gear engages the bull gear over one sector and the oilpump gear over another. If the initiating event occurred in the bullgear sector, you can destroy teeth there while the oilpump mesh remains intact. Gear failures can be highly localized.

Another possibility is torsional vibration from a worn or failed crankshaft damper. Without proper damping, oscillations fatigue the tooth roots with cyclic loads until material is lost. The bull gear typically sees higher and more variable torque because it drives multiple accessories, so it tends to fail first. The oil pump sees a steadier load with lower inertia changes, making it less likely to be the initial failure point.

A brief accessory seizure could also transmit a shock through the bull gear. Because it distributes torque to the fuel pump drive, air compressor, water pump, and other accessories, a momentary bind can shear


one or two adjacent teeth without affecting the oil-pump mesh.

Prior repair history matters as well. Pressfit gears require proper heating, alignment, and seating depth. A crank gear installed with slight runout can gradually degrade the mesh. The failure appears sudden even though the process began long before. In such cases, the bullgear mesh, which carries more variable load, often shows damage first. The oil pump, with steadier loading, may not exhibit the same symptoms.

In summary, the oil pump likely survived due to geometry and duty cycle. The crank gear's engage-

ment arcs allow damage to be confined to the bullgear sector. If the failure occurred there, the oilpump mesh would not encounter the broken teeth. Operationally, the pump's steadier load profile makes catastrophic tooth failure less likely. It is still vulnerable to issues like starvation or contamination, but in scenarios driven by shock loads, misalignment, or torsional vibration, it is less likely to be the primary fail-

KANE, PA... Custom builds can take a while to execute. Bigler Boyz's custom 2026 Kenworth W900 wrecker took 2 years from start to finish – 14 months in planning and finished 10 months after placing the order with Youngstown Kenworth's Dave Claypool.

The twin steer conversion was installed in Canada before the truck arrived at Custom Built Mfg., LLC. Custom Built Mfg. installed the 75 ton boom with two 60,000 pound winches, two 20,000 pound winches, and a 50,000 pound drag winch. They also installed the subframe, tool boxes and pretty much everything else. To date, this is the biggest wrecker they have ever built.

The Kenworth is powered by a 605 hp Cummins with 52,000 pound rears and an 18 speed transmission.

ATA Applauds DOT Crackdown on CDL Mills

Washington, DC... The American Trucking Associations applauded an announcement by the U.S. Department of Transportation and Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration that aligns with ATA's longstanding priority to keep roads safe by enhancing training, testing, and licensing standards for CDL-holders.

USDOT Secretary Sean Duffy and FMCSA Administrator Derek Barrs unveiled new actions to investigate and crack down on fraudulent "CDL mills" and other noncompliant Entry-Level Driver Training (ELDT) programs across the country. Additionally, the agencies pledged to continue their effort to enforce English language proficiency standards as a baseline requirement for operating on our nation's roadways.

"Proper driver training is the baseline for highway safety, which is why we commend Secretary Duffy and Administrator Barrs for closing dangerous loopholes, enforcing existing regulations, and ensuring that only qualified, well-trained drivers are operating on our nation's roadways," said ATA President & CEO "Thanks Chris Spear. to their leadership, we are making significant strides to root out bad actors and ensure every new commercial driver high-quality, receives consistent training before getting behind the wheel."

largest national association representing the trucking industry, ATA and its members recognize the critical importance of a trained, qualified driver workforce," Spear continued. "By continuing to partner with the Trump Administration, can ensure that drivers meet our high standards of safety and professionalism."

Currently, CDL schools allowed to selfcertify that their training programs comply with federal ELDT standards before their students test for a commercial driver's license. These providers are then listed FMCSA's Training Provider Registry, which is intended to serve as a trusted resource for drivers and motor carriers. However, the integrity of that system has been undermined by insufficient oversight and enforcement to verify that providers are, in fact, meeting required safety

and training standards.

ATA has repeatedly called stronger for oversight and accountability eliminate fraudulent or substandard CDL training providers that undermine roadway safety and public confidence. Earlier this month, ATA sent a letter to Congress urging greater federal action to identify and remove noncompliant training providers from **FMCSA's** Training Provider Registry well as strengthen enforcement of ELDT moving forward. April, ATA also sent a letter to DOT outlining specific enforcement measures needed strengthen compliance with ELDT requirements and protect the integrity of the training, testing, and licensing processes nationwide.

FMCSA Re-Issues Temporary Waiver for Medical Examiner's Certificates

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) has re-issued a temporary waiver allowing interstate CDL holders, commercial learner's permit (CLP) holders, and motor carriers to continue relying on a paper copy of the medical examiner's certificate as proof of a driver's medical certification. This waiver allows paper certificates to remain valid for up to 60 days after the date of issuance.

The waiver is in effect from October 13, 2025, through January 10, 2026.

This action is intended to support drivers, carriers, and State Driver's Licensing Agencies (SDLAs) during the ongoing transition to the secure electronic transmission of medical certification data required under the National Registry II (NRII) final rule. FMCSA determined that reissuing the waiver is in the public interest to prevent unnecessary hardship on drivers and employers due to potential processing delays outside of

FMCSA also recommends that certified medical examiners continue issuing paper medical examiner's certificates (Form MCSA-5876) to drivers, in addition to submitting examination results electronically, until further notice.

Q3 Truckstop.com/ **Bloomberg Survey: Carriers Remain Resilient** as Market Pressures Persist

Boise, ID... A new Q3 2025 survey of owner-operators and small fleets from Truckstop.com and Bloomberg Intelligence shows a mixed economic outlook, with expectations for volume and freight recoveries moving in different directions.

"Many believe the bottom may be near in terms of volumes, and are cautiously preparing for better days ahead, despite ongoing pessimism on rate recovery," said Todd Markusic, Customer Insights Manager at Truckstop.com.

Volume Held Steady, Outlook Hopeful

Load volume trends in Q3 indicated a return to stability. Most carriers (60%) saw volumes in Q3 2025 either up or the same as the same period last year, and 80% expect volumes to either increase (50%) or remain flat (30%) over the next six months. Forty-four percent were unsure when the market would bottom out and rebound.

Confidence Despite Rate Pressures

Fifteen percent of carriers said their Q3 revenue grew year over year. Another 42% reported revenue stayed steady YoY. When asked about the next six months, 37% expect rates to improve, down from 55% at the start of

Despite the uncertainty, carriers signaled a bit more appetite for capital investment, with 29% planning to buy new tractors or trailers in the next six months-up from

The Impact of Tariffs and CDL Rules

On the policy front, most carriers (69%) believe tariffs will harm the trucking industry, up 4 points from Q2. Regarding the recent federal enforcement of English-language proficiency requirements, 79% expect it to affect

> trucking, and 41% think it will have a significant im-Overall, carriers are

> committed: fewer than 1 in 10 carriers are considering leaving the industry in the next 6 months. This number has stayed the same since Q1. In fact, job satisfaction rose in Q3: 60% of carriers say they are satisfied with their work, up from 54% in Q2. Only 15% report being dissatisfied.

"The industry's current conditions are testing every business, especially small fleets," Markusic said. "But carriers are adapting and showing resiliency."

The Truckstop.com/ Bloomberg Intelligence survey gathered insights from 211 carriers, of which 80% were owner-operators or small fleets with five or fewer trucks. Flatbed carriers made up the largest segment at 59%.







"I Came Into Trucking Looking for a Fresh Start"

From one truck to a thriving fleet, Chris Schwanke built something far greater than success.

On a cool Kentucky morning, sunlight bounces off a line of gleaming Peterbilts, each polished enough to catch the reflection of their owner's quiet pride. Standing between them, hands in pockets and a knowing smile on his face, is Chris Schwanke, a man who rebuilt his life one mile, one truck, and one relationship at a time.

"I came into trucking looking for a fresh start," Chris says. "But I found a lot more than that."

Before the highway became his calling, Chris spent fifteen years running a construction company in northwest Indiana. The work was steady but the reward never seemed to match the effort. So, in 2018, he left it all behind and headed south to Arkansas. He didn't know it

then, but that leap of faith would open the road to something bigger: a new career, a new mission, and a new way to serve others.

Everything he saw in Arkansas job listings read, CDL required. His father had been a driver, and the idea had always lingered in the back of his mind. "I figured I'd give it a year," he recalls. "One year turned into six trucks."

Chris started at Prime

Inc., where he earned his license, bought his first truck, and, true to form, started helping others do the same. The student quickly became the teacher. Soon he was training new drivers, mentoring friends, and building a reputation for treating everyone like family. "I can't be successful all by myself," he says. "I'm only as good as the people who work with me and for me."

That belief became the foundation of his small fleet, now operating under Mercer Transportation. What began as one truck has grown into a thriving operation run with his wife, Judy, who manages fuel costs, payroll, and dispatch from home. He's also quick to credit Sarah lesson he ever gave me," Newton, his Mercer coordinator, for playing a vital role in keeping everything running smoothly.

"Sarah is an integral part of my business," Chris says. "She understands what we're trying to do and helps us make it happen. Without people like her, I couldn't be as successful as I am."

Chris is the kind of leader who builds people, not just trucks. Jamar Mincy, one of Chris's first students, remembers meeting him during what he calls "one of the roughest times" in his life. "I was ready to quit trucking," Mincy says. "Chris believed in me when I didn't believe in myself. He showed me the ropes, gave me confidence, and pushed me to keep going. He's more than a trainer, he's a role model."

Mentorship runs deep in Chris's family, too. His nephew Zachary Schwanke, now a Mercer fleet owner himself, describes his uncle as "a father figure who helped raise me."

"The most important Zachary says, "was to be a man of your word. If you say you're going to be there for someone, be there."

That sense of responsibility isn't new to Chris. It's been a part of his life long before trucking. Back in Michigan City, Indiana, he served as president of the city council, managing a \$42 million budget and leading community initiatives. He's always believed leadership means showing up, whether that's at a council meeting, a truck yard, or a neighbor's door at 1 a.m. to shovel snow for someone in need.

These days, his leadership takes a new form through his membership in the Guardian Riders, a nonprofit motorcycle group that supports veterans and their families. The group raises funds and lends hands to help with everything from replacing roofs to building wheelchair ramps for vets in need.

Earlier this year, Chris hauled a special load of grave markers for veterans from Georgia to Michigan City, Indiana, his home-

"When you stand in that warehouse surrounded by hundreds of headstones," he says, "you realize each one represents a life that served this country. Getting them where they belong? That meant something to me."

Though Chris isn't a veteran himself, his respect for service runs deep. His father and nephew both served, and through Guardian Riders, he honors that legacy in action. "How do you not give back?" he asks. "Look at what we've been blessed with. It's just the right thing to do."

When he talks about Mercer, his gratitude is quiet but clear. "At Mercer, I found a home," he says. "They care about their people, they care about veterans, and they give you the freedom to build something meaningful. That's what keeps me here."

As the morning sun climbs higher, Chris steps up onto the running board of his truck, scanning the lot as his drivers roll in. He waves, checks a mirror, and smiles. The engines rumble to life, a low steady chorus that feels less like work and more like rhythm... The sound of a life rebuilt on purpose.

The open road has been more than miles for Chris Schwanke. It's been a road to second chances, leadership, and making a differ-

Community In The Trucking Industry?

I have heard all the excuses why community among believers in the trucking industry cannot happen. And that is just what they are.... EXCUSES. On top of that we have ignored the biblical mandate God has given us concerning the need for believers to meet together no matter what their occupation or time constraints.




