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

He was beloved by associates and continued to maintain office hours until two weeks prior to his death. The truck is equipped with an APU, so it does not idle, he runs the Rocky Mountains and he's averaging between 7.1 and 9 MPG. CD has put 430,000 miles on this truck, running the catalyst since April. It's a full emissions truck, with zero problems. He inspected the DPF last week and it's spotless, no soot in the exhaust system. 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# **Latest Trucking Industry News**

#### **ATA Truck Tonnage Index** Fell 3.5% in November -**Index 2.1% Lower than** November 2018

Arlington, VA... American Trucking Associations' advanced seasonally adjusted (SA) For-Hire Truck Tonnage Index decreased 3.5% in November after falling 0.7% in October. In November, the index equaled 113.5 (2015=100) compared with 117.6 in October.

"It's tough to sugar coat November's reading," said ATA Chief Economist Bob Costello. "It was the third decrease in the last four months and the index is down 7.2% since July. Additionally, November was the first month to see a year-over-year drop in the index since April 2017. While disappointing, it fits with the expected soft gross domestic product reading expected in the fourth quarter and reports of a soft fall freight season.

It is important to note that ATA's tonnage data is dominated by contract freight.

October's reading was revised down compared with our November press release.

Compared with November 2018, the SA index fell 2.1%. the first year-over-year decline since April 2017 and the largest drop since February of that year. The index is up 3.3% year-to-date compared with the same period last year.

The not seasonally adjusted index, which represents the change in tonnage actually hauled by the fleets before any seasonal adjustment, equaled 115 in November, 7.9% below the October level (124.8). In calculating the index, 100 represents 2015.

Trucking serves as a barometer of the U.S. economy, representing 70.2% of tonnage carried by all modes of domestic freight transportation, including manufactured and retail goods. Trucks hauled 10.77 billion tons of freight in 2017. Motor carriers collected \$700.1 billion, or 79.3% of total revenue earned by all transport modes.

ATA calculates the tonnage index based on surveys from its membership and has been doing so since the 1970s. This is a preliminary figure and subject to change in the final report issued around the 5th day of each month. The report includes month-to-month and year-over-year results, relevant economic comparisons, and key financial indicators.

#### **OOIDA Thanks Rep. Babin** For Speaking Out On **Truck Driver Coercion**, **Highlighting Flaws With** NCCDB

Owner-Operator Independent and transportation interme-Drivers Association thanks U.S. Rep. Brian Babin, R-Texas, for calling out federal regulators and their inaction regarding regulations and the dangers truck driver coercion. Rep. Babin sent a letter to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration expressing alarm that the agency's programs that are supposed to address reports of unsafe or coercive behavior by some businesses within the trucking industry are wholly ineffective.

"The very agency that oversees highway safety among commercial vehicles should be a far better example of protecting the hard-working men and women expected to comply with its safety regulations," said OOIDA President, Todd Spencer. "Instead, the programs intended to prevent or stop coercing drivers into violating safety regulations are not being implemented as intended."

> 'Congress recognized the importance of protecting America's truckers from coercion when it required FMCSA to establish a process to investigate carriers, shippers, and receivers that push drivers to violate safety rules," said Rep. Babin. "While the agency has established this system, I've heard from too many truckers that it has not been effective or reliable. It is time to make sure that FMCSA is holding up its end of the bargain and properly addressing claims brought forward by drivers."

The Association looks forand the agency in making sure the problems in those programs are resolved and commercial drivers can confidently report incidences of coercion and ultimately improve highway safety.

### **ATA Applauds Ratification** of USMCA Trade Deal North American Trade Pact Will Provide Boost to **Trucking Industry**

Arlington, VA... The American Trucking Associations commended Congress and the Trump administration for ratification of the U.S. - Mexico - Canada Agreement, setting the stage for increased free, fair and equitable trade between our three countries.

"Trade is central to the trucking industry – 76% of all surface freight between the U.S. and our nearest neighbors moves by truck - so the newly ratified USMCA will be a boon to our economy and our industry," said ATA President and CEO Chris Spear. "This agreement will boost both U.S. exports and gross domestic product, meaning more truck movements and delivering measurable returns for our industry."

USMCA is projected to increase annual U.S. exports to Canada and Mexico by a combined \$33 billion above the current NAFTA baseline. The agreement is also expected to increase U.S. GDP by \$68 billion, stimulating broad sectors of the economy that the trucking industry services, like agriculture and manufacturing.

"NAFTA was the oldest of our 17 trade agreements and due for the sorts of modernization that USMCA made," said ATA Chief Economist Senior Vice President of International Trade Policy and Cross-Border Operations Bob Costello. "With this new trade agreement in place, we can expect to see increases ward to working with Congress in exports to Canada and Mexico and a measurable increase in our gross domestic product in the years ahead. Because trucks move 70% of all freight in the U.S., implementation of USMCA will have direct benefits to the trucking industry."

#### **PA Turnpike** Reminds **Travelers** of **2020 Toll** Increase

HARRISBURG, PA... The PA Turnpike Commission (PTC) wants to remind customers that effective Jan. 5th, tolls increased six percent for cash, E-ZPass and TOLL BY PLATE customers. The increase, approved by the commissioners last July, takes effect on all sections and extensions excluding three western PA "cashless" tolling facilities.

The most common toll for a passenger vehicle will increase from \$1.40 to \$1.50 for E-ZPass customers and from \$2.30 to \$2.50 for cash customers. The most common toll for a Class-5 tractor trailer will increase from \$3.70 to \$4.00 for E-ZPass and from \$16.30 to \$17.30 for cash. The cashless toll at the westbound Delaware River Bridge will increase from \$5.30 to \$5 70 for E-ZPass customers and from \$7.20 to \$7.70 for those who use PA Turnpike TOLL BY PLATE. Since 2009 the PTC has increased tolls annually to fulfill a funding obligation required by Act 44 of 2009. As a result, the PTC has delivered more than \$6 billion in funding to PennDOT in the last decade. By law, these payments support mass transit statewide, with the bulk of funding supporting transit in Philadelphia and Pittsburgh. The PA Turnpike Commission strives to provide a reliable roadway that outpaces national averages in ride quality, safety and incidentresponse rates. More than 85 percent of the PTC's capital plan reflects a focus on mobility and safety. To date more than 144 miles of its roadway system, which turns 80 years old this year, have been reconstructed. 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# **ECM Shipping Damage**

I'm no shipping expert but my daily routine usually starts with a stack of shipping parcels, each packed with one or more DDEC ECMs. Over the years I've opened thousands of shipping parcels and shipped out thousands more and sometimes I get questions on that. It isn't very often that I open one up and find fresh case damage and chucks of aluminum at the bottom of the box but when I find damage it's usually because the ECM was mailed in nothing but a paper envelope or plastic bubble mailer. I like bubble mailers but only when used inside a cardboard box. If you're shipping an ECM put it in a box and shake the box. You shouldn't hear or feel anything banging around. If you do you need a smaller box or more packing material. The box DDECs come in from Detroit has two layers of cardboard along the edges and the box has strong corners. The four mounting ears on the corners of the ECM are the easiest to damage. Protect these mounting ears by shipping the ECM in a box with strong corners or for even better protection prevent the corners from making direct contact with the inside of the box with foam, bubble wrap, paper, or some other light weight packing. I use bubble mailers inside a box and so far, have not had one job arrive with shipping damage. An ECM that is packed this way in a flat rate USPS or the UPS/ FedEx equivalent boxes will be reasonably well protected. Larger boxes offer better protection but even if shipping weight doesn't come up, you'll pay more in shipping because of the size. Here are some prices to ship a 7 pound DDEC ECM from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania to Shelton, Washington with a declared and insured value of \$1000.



13"x12" boxes provide reasonable protection for ECMs.

If you're shipping multiple ECMs use a little bubble wrap to prevent the ECM cases from making contact with one another. If you get enough of them together and they're making contact and banging around an ECM might get cracked. If that happens, I can replace the case for about \$500. I have yet to see an ECM get damaged in shipping that's been individually wrapped in bubble wrap and shipped in a box.

Mandatory updates to .php require me to rebuild <u>www.Dieselcontrolservice.com</u>. While the website is down don't be fooled by other ECM rebuilder websites that post my YouTube videos or photos of me. I don't know who most of these guys are so be careful! If they say they sent me your ECM for service call or text 412-327-9400 with your ECM serial number so I can verify it. If you provide a cell phone number, I'll almost always text over photos or video of your ECM when I service it.

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#### **Turnover Rate** at Truckload **Carriers Rose in Third Quarter Since 2018**

Arlington, VA... The annualized turnover rate at both large and small truckload carriers rose in the third quarter, according to American Trucking Associations' Quarterly Employment Report.

The turnover rate at large truckload fleets - those with more than \$30 million in annual revenue – jumped nine points, the largest quarterly increase since the second quarter of 2016, to an annualized rate of 96%. The increase set the figure at its highest point since the second guarter of 2018. The churn rate at smaller carriers also rose – ticking up six points to 73% from the lowest level since 2011.

"Counterintuitively, we saw turnover rise even as the freight demand was relatively soft," said ATA Chief Economist

Bob Costello. "While turnover rose at both small and large carriers, the reasons were quite different. Large carriers reduced the number of drivers they employed, in keeping with lackluster freight levels, but smaller carriers added to their driver pools, increasing their number of drivers by 1.9%.

"During the first two quarters of the year, larger carriers added drivers, but in the third quarter they started right-sizing their fleets. Conversely, smaller companies increased their driver pool in the third quarter for the first time this year," he said.

Turnover at less-than-truckload carriers dropped four points to an annualized rate of 9% - the lowest level it has been at since the final quarter of 2017.

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#### **PA Turnpike Commission** to Implement New Special **Hauling Permit System** For Overweight/ **Over-Dimensional Vehicles**

On Dec. 18, 2019, the PA permits until payment is made. Turnpike Commission approved a new permit fee structure at cashless tolling points only across our system for overweight/over-dimensional vehicles. Beginning Jan. 5, these vehicles must apply for a Special Hauling Permit and pay a \$37 flat fee along with an additional 24 cent-per-ton-mile fee on all weight in excess of tolling locations are:

<sup>\*</sup> Gateway Toll Plaza Milepost 2, I-76 (near Ohio line); \* Beaver Valley Expressway

(PA Turnpike 376);

Turnpike 576);

\* Greensburg Bypass/AKH (PA Turnpike 66); and

\* Delaware River Bridge Toll Plaza, Milepost 42.6, I-95 (near NJ line);

\* Keyser Avenue and Clarks Summit Toll Plazas, Mileposts comparable to those of existing 122 and 131, (I-476 near Scranton).

Changes for Overweight/ Over-dimensional customers at cashless tolling locations only include:

\*All customers applying for a Special Hauling Permit for Overweight/Over-dimensional vehicles must pay a new permit fee online using a credit card or ACH when the application is submitted. There will be no print function for approved

\* All customers must print and carry a hard copy of the approved permit.

Tolls will be assessed electronically as customers travel the cashless tolling system. There is no need to stop to process permits or pay tolls at cashless tolling locations.

\* Tolls will be charged to vour E-ZPass account; if you 80,000 pounds. Those cashless do not have E-ZPass, an invoice will be mailed to the registered owner of the vehicle through the PA Turnpike TOLL BY PLATE system.

\* All customers must apply \* Findlay Connector (PA for a permit within two weeks of the anticipated travel day.

While the permit fees for overweight and over-dimensional haulers at cashless tolling locations are new, the toll rates have been adjusted so that the overall trip costs are Class-9 toll rates.

The PA Turnpike's standard permit requirements weight, width, length, height, etc.—remain in effect for these new Special Hauling Permit procedures at cashless tolling locations. 

If there are snowstorms in heaven, you can be sure that Pat Herring will be the first to arrive to help those in need. Rest in peace, Pat.











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
