

## **High Performance Diesels with Bruce Mallinson**

#### A New Evolution Of OPS For Modern Engines

Downtime is always a surprise, at least that is what the paperwork says. Out in the real world, most engine failures do not show up like lightning. They show up as a slow grind: heat, soot, fine debris, and oil that keeps doing its job right up until it does not. And because the truck still starts and pulls, it is easy to pretend everything is fine, until it is fine

on the side of the road.

That is the whole point of OPS Gen 2. It is built for the miles between oil changes, where the damage actually happens, caused by microscopic contamination circulating through tight clearances all day, every day, wearing things down one invisible scrape at a time. You can run good oil, you can have a clean-looking dipstick,

and you can still be grinding away at bearings and rings like you are trying to "save money" in the most expensive way possible.

OPS Gen 2 leans hard into filtration because that is where it counts. It uses a synthetic micro glass filter designed to catch particles down to 3 microns, the stuff you are not going to see, feel, or brag about, but the stuff that contributes to long-term wear. Long-term wear is exactly how you end up writing five-figure checks while telling yourself it "came

out of nowhere." Keeping that fine contamination out of circulation is how you make the engine's life easier and your wallet less emotionally involved in your maintenance plan.

Gen 2 also takes a more modern approach to system design. Engines built since the mid-to-late 2000s often run hot enough, depending on duty cycle and operating temps, that some liquid contaminants can be driven off during normal operation. So instead of leaning on an external evaporator as the centerpiece, Gen 2 keeps filtration and monitoring as the main act. Translation: fewer extra parts to mount, fewer things to route, and fewer "creative" installation solutions that look good until service day.

Now let's talk about the part that directly saves you money. OPS Gen 2 gives you real-time visibility into oil condition, so you can make smarter decisions instead of changing oil on a calendar just because that is how it has always been done. When you can see what the oil is doing, you can tell the difference between oil that is actually done and oil that is still serviceable. That means you are not automatically dumping good oil, and you are not gambling by running oil that is past its usefulness either. It can also help you identify when you need to add base oil to maintain the proper level and keep the oil performing correctly. In plain terms, it helps you decide whether to change the oil, add base, or let it

keep going. And speaking of decisions, let's talk about oil sampling. The old way usually involves a mess, wasted time, and someone saying they will do it later. Later turns into never and never turns into guessing. OPS Gen 2 includes a push-button sampling valve, which means you can pull a clean sample quickly without turning it into a production. When

pens, and oil analysis becomes useful instead of decorative.

Because one oil report does not tell you much. It is a snapshot. A trend is what matters. With consistent samples, you can track contamination patterns, wear metal movement, and changes that indicate something is starting to go sideways, catching problems early instead of catching them with a tow bill and a hotel receipt.

Fitment is handled like someone has installed parts on real trucks before. Gen 2 is designed for versatile mounting on the frame and runs under constant oil pressure, which helps around real chassis limitations and makes installs repeatable and serviceable across units.

Finally, Pittsburgh Power is involved as part of the OPS Gen 2 system, not just as a logo on a box. Their team helps monitor results and supports fleets and owner operators with real mechanical advice rooted in decades of seeing what fails, why it fails, and what "normal" actually looks like. Because oil analysis does not help if you do not know what to do with it, and what you

and straight answer.

OPS Gen 2 is set to be available soon. It is for the people who want fewer surprises, fewer emergency repairs, and fewer davs that start with, "Well, that is not ideal." Keep the oil cleaner, make sampling realistic, watch what is happening inside the engine, and have a team you can call when you want the straight answer.

For the past 48 years working with owner operators and small fleets we along with you, our owner operators clients have proven the industry wrong. For years I was

told I would never be successful giving truck drivers horsepower and torque, however with your help we proved them wrong. The first thing I told my critics was I don't deal with truck drivers, I work with owner operators, and many of them are just like me, whatever they drive must run good, or let's say great. Together we have proven that a great running diesel engine, properly driven and maintained, will always get better fuel mileage, live longer and put a smile on the owner operators face. My goal has always been to hear you say, " I love my truck since you tuned it or built the engine." The word LOVE is a very strong word, and when a man, or woman, loves their truck, several things happen. First, they enjoy driving the truck, it is no longer an effort to go to work. Second, the truck is driven easier, they never have to mash the throttle, just another 1/4 to 1/2 inch of throttle the truck picks up and charges into the hill or mountain. Third, they enjoy driving truck is taken care of much better than a stock, unresponsive truck. It's kept cleaner and gets anything it needs. Fourth, it's addictive to drive, it's a natural high on every hill, a great running diesel en-

gine will allow the brain to release adrenaline, dopamine, and endorphins, which Kevin Rutherford told me is more powerful than cocaine. Maybe this is why many owner operators with great running trucks never want to fully retire. In closing of this paragraph I want to thank so many of you owner operators for your friendship, loyalty, and giving me the opportunity to make your life better along with mine. Please think about joining me at the annual Owner Operator snowmobile conference this February in Dayton, Wyoming at the Bear Lodge on February 18, arrival, and departing on February 22nd. Our speaker and tour director is Mike Johnson, retired US Army and now an owner operator. Mike was in the Army for 21 years and will talk about being a sniper. # From The Oregon DOT - Kuebler Boulevard to Delaney Road Nighttime Closures Mid-January

Plan ahead for upcoming full I-5 nighttime closures mid-January

As part of our I-5 widening project between Kuebler Boulevard and Delaney Road, we're building a new Battle Creek Road Bridge, which will connect to a roundabout east of I-5.

Planned nightly I-5 closure January 12 - 14, 2026

To safely do this work, we need to close both directions of I-5 nightly for three nights in mid-January. During the closures, you can expect:

- \* Nighttime full I-5 closures in both directions January 12 14.
- \* I-5 closures to last between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m.
- \* All traffic to detour onto Commercial Street SE and Kuebler Boulevard, depending on the direction you need to go.
- $^{\ast}$  North and south bound I-5 to reopen to traffic after 5 a.m.

\* Delays and construction noise.

These dates are tentative. Use TripCheck.com for the most up-to-date information on traffic and impacts. If our schedule changes, we'll send out another update.

Northbound I-5 detour

To get around the closure, travelers should follow the signed detour:

- \*To Commercial Street SE.
- \* Right on Kuebler Boulevard.
- \*Back onto northbound I-5.

Southbound I-5 detour

To get around the closure, travelers should follow the signed detour:

- \*Exit onto Kuebler Boulevard.
- \*Left on Commercial Street SE.
- \*Back onto southbound I-5.
- If you're traveling through the area now, you can expect:
- \* Construction noise.

#### **EPA Indicates It Will Proceed With** 2027 NOx Standards

The American Trucking Associations (ATA) recently informed its members that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has indicated it plans to move forward with the Model Year 2027 start date for its heavy-duty nitrogen oxides (NOx emissions rule. ATA conveyed that this information was provided through ongoing communications with the agency regarding the status of the regulation.

This update follows a coordinated national advocacy effort. On August 13, 2025, PMTA joined ATA, national carrier groups, and all other state trucking associations in signing a letter urging EPA to delay implementation and reconsider key components of the rule. Background

The heavy-duty NOx rule, finalized in December 2022 under EPA's "Clean Trucks Plan," establishes some of the most stringent emissions requirements ever applied to diesel-powered trucks. Major provisions include substantial reductions in allowable NOx emissions, extended useful-life requirements, expanded warranty obligations, and enhanced testing and durability standards for engine manufacturers. As currently written, these changes will take effect beginning with Model Year 2027 engines and vehicles. The August 13 letter submitted by ATA and state trucking associations requested a delay in the effective date to 2031 and called for additional time for manufacturers, service networks, and fleets to prepare. The letter also highlighted the economic pressures facing carriers, the challenges of integrating new technologies on compressed timelines, and the need for greater regulatory certainty. PMTA signed the letter due to the anticipated impacts on Pennsylvania fleets, which operate in one of the nation's most freight-intensive states.

**Implications** According to ATA's communication to its members, EPA has indicated that it does not plan to shift the 2027 start date, despite the industry's request. At the same time, the agency is reportedly working on revisions to the rule, which could affect technical requirements such as durability standards, test procedures, and warranty provisions. The result of these changes could ultimately lower costs and make compliance more manageable.

These revisions are expected to be released as a formal proposal sometime in 2026.

EPA's intention to keep the

2027 start date - even as it works on revisions leaves carriers preparing for a rule whose final requirements are not yet fully known. Fleets may face higher equipment and compliance costs depending on how the revised standards are structured, and maintenance operations could need to adjust to updated emissions-control technologies. The short timeline also limits how much flexibility fleets have in their replacement and budgeting plans. Overall, the combination of a fixed implementation date and pending revisions creates continued uncertainty for carriers across the Commonwealth.

Looking Ahead On a hopeful front, legislation to eliminate the 12% Federal Excise Tax was reintroduced earlier this year by Rep. Doug LaMalfa (R-Calif.), a senior member of the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee. Supporters argue that the tax, originally

enacted during World War I, discourages truck buyers from replacing older, less efficient vehicles and represents the highest percentage-based excise tax imposed on any product. Industry groups welcome the effort, noting that FET can add more than \$20,000 to \$24,000 to the price of a new clean-diesel tractor-trailer.

Federal emissions policy continues to evolve, and the heavy-duty NO? rule is a central component of EPA's clean-air strategy for the coming decade. While forthcoming revisions may address some of the concerns raised by the industry, the 2027 deadline remains a significant challenge for fleets. PMTA remains committed to ensuring that Pennsylvania's trucking companies are informed, represented, and supported as this regulatory transition and other potential changes move forward.

#### Pennsylvania's Non-Domiciled CDL **Process Under Renewed Scrutiny**

Pennsylvania's dures for issuing commercial driver's licenses (CDLs) to non-U.S. residents are receiving renewed attention following recent federal actions and a high-profile arrest involving a Pennsylvania-issued CDL.

In October 2025, the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) identified Pennsylvania as one of six states issuing non-domiciled CDLs in a manner not fully consistent with federal regulations. FMCSA cited concerns about verifying lawful presence and ensuring that CDL expiration dates do not extend beyond an applicant's authorized length of stay. Following that notice, PennDOT voluntarily paused issuing, renewing, transferring, or upgrading non-domiciled CDLs and commercial learner's per-

Last week, the issue resurfaced after the arrest of a 31-year-old Uzbek national in Kansas who held a valid Pennsylvania non-domiciled CDL. Federal officials allege the individual terror-related ties. Although the driver possessed federal work-authorization documents at the time of issuance, the case prompted renewed questions about documentation and verification procedures across states.

In addition to the October findings, the U.S. Department of Transportation has now warned Pennsylvania that up to approximately \$75 million in federal highway funding could be withheld if the state does not fully correct the compliance issues identified in FMCSA's review.

Governor Josh Shapiro and PennDOT officials maintain that the Commonwealth uses the federal SAVE (Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements) system to verify lawful presence and that their internal reviews have not shown a case in which an ineligible individual was

knowingly issued a CDL. Federal officials, however, say further improvements to documentation and record-matching procedures are required.

State lawmakers are preparing additional oversight. Senator Judy Ward, chair of the Senate Transportation Committee, has announced a committee hearing to examine PennDOT's CDL and REAL ID verification processes and gather testimony from state and federal officials.

PMTA will continue to track these developments and provide updates to members as more information becomes available.

#### Intermodal **Stays Ahead in Third Quarter**

CALVERTON, Total intermodal volumes rose 2.8 percent year-overyear in the third quarter of 2025, according to the Intermodal Association of North America. International containers added 4.4 percent, domestic containers improved 2.5 percent, while trailers fell 18.7 per-

Key highlights:

Domestic container strength - Domestic container traffic recorded its highest September volume ever, rising 5.8 percent year-over-year. This segment's strong growth was supported by increasing manufacturing activity and a successful capture of modal share from trucking, which experienced low rates and high operating

International container sensitivity - July saw record volumes domestic suppliers «frontloaded» in anticipation of tariff increases, with following in weakness August. This volatility overall annual growth for IPI to slow to just 0.6 percent year-overyear in September.

Trucking capacity constraints - Despite a current sluggish freight environment, future tightening in the trucking market is pected to significantly benefit domestic intermodal. Pressures like a surge in insurance premium costs and declining Class 8 truck orders are aligning to constrain the available driver supply and fleet capacity.

Five of the seven highestdensity trade corridors, which collectively handled more than 60 percent of total volume, were up. The Trans-Canada increased 17.3 percent; the Intra-Southeast climbed 8.0 percent; and the Northeast-Midwest grew 5.5 percent. South Central-Southwest managed 1.5 percent, and the highest volume corridor, the Midwest-Southwest, eked out 0.9 percent. The Southeast-Southwest fell 7.0 percent, while Midwest-Northwest dropped 13.0 percent.





#### She Didn't Set Out to Be a Hero: The Quiet Power of Sheila McCutchan



Sheila McCutchan didn't set out to be a trailblazer in logistics either. She set out to teach.

Born and raised in Evansville and a graduate of the University of Evansville with a degree in elementary education, Sheila's early life felt far removed from freight: "I worked as a pharmacy tech all through high school and college," she remembers. When a post-college job didn't appear, she pivoted into systems work for Humana and later McKesson-practical moves that quietly set the stage for something else: a career built on problem-solving, relationships, and a relentless calm under pressure.

"I went in and was like, 'Oh, it's fun what you guys do," Sheila says about her first days around the freight business. What began as convenience-working alongside her husband's office and avoiding nights away from home-turned into a vocation. When the Danville (DAN) office needed a steady hand during the recession, Sheila stepped up in 2008 and took it over. If the industry looks chaotic from the outside, Sheila describes it like a jigsaw puzzle: "It's basically just

putting pieces of a puzzle together." A customer emails a late bid: a driver calls in from the road; a forklift runs out of gas. The agent's job, invisible to many end customers, is to make those edges line up. "You have to call trucks... make sure the drivers can be out of their other load in time...sometimes you'll make 40 or 50 calls on a load to get everything lined up," she says. That tenacity, combined with genuine care for people, is what earned her recognition long before the recent spotlight.

This spring, Sheila was named a CLT Hero at the Expeditors Carrier Awards—a distinction she calls meaningful because it's peer-nominated. "They just nominated me and said that I'm always available to help them with their loads, and I always make sure appointments are made, that drivers are on time, and that I communicate with the shipper," she explains. Sheila still remembers the moment she learned she'd won. "I was thrilled! It was nice to be rewarded for my and my team's hard work." For her, the award isn't a single heroic moment; it's

a nod to years of consistent, steady work. "I think it's over time," she reflects. "I've worked with the same guy pretty much the whole time he's been there. So, I feel like they're showing their appreciation of my work ethic throughout the many years, not just like 1 or 2 instances, but for the long haul, year over year."

Her steadiness defines her work. She's had a string of career pivots turned into a practice rooted in relationships and resolve. Sheila credits the human side of the job for this: "I know what their families are doing, what their kids are doing... it's just a relationship kind of thing." She's frank about the demands: "You gotta love it or don't do it because there can be a lot of stress with the job." And when she makes a promise, it carries weight. "If I say I'm going to get a load for them, I'm going to get it for them." Her attitude has helped Sheila develop trusting and loyal relationships with everyone she works with.

Her approach also reflects the kind of partnership Mercer aims to foster. Sheila speaks warmly about the company's systems and people: "They give us the tools we need to be successful... the coordinators are always willing to help," she says. And where the industry can feel mechanical, she emphasizes Mercer's human strengths: "Mercer is known for billing quickly and paying drivers quickly. So, I think we're pretty much at the top of the industry in my opinion."

Growth has followed that combination of grit and grace. Sheila recalls transforming the Danville agency from modest beginnings: "When I took over, they were doing about a million a year. Now the agency, at its best, moves 10 million in a year." She shares her proudest achievement of "just being able to grow this from pretty much nothing, up to being a top 15

agent now," with graceful pride that makes the numbers feel more personal than hoastful

Outside of work, Sheila is grounded by the things that matter most to her: family and the chance to experience life beyond the office. "My kids, my grandson, and traveling. We travel a lot," she says simply, but it's clear those few words carry weight. For someone who spends her days solving problems and lining up moving parts, time with family and time away serve as a necessary counterbalance. The flexibility of remote work has allowed her not just to manage freight, but to manage life. Now, being in South Carolina allows her to be present for the moments that don't appear on any schedule or spreadsheet.

For those seeking an example of quiet leadership, Sheila's career is instructive. She didn't arrive as a superstar; she arrived curious, patient, and willing to learn from those she admired at agent meetings. She treats every relationship as an investment and measures success not just by revenue, but by respect: "People respect you, and people acknowledge what you're doing for them," she says. "That's the biggest part."

That humble confidence is the throughline of her story: a woman who moved from classrooms and pharmacy counters to the world of freight because she loved the work, the people, and the challenge. The CLT Hero award acknowledged what drivers and partners have known for years: Sheila McCutchan is the kind of agent who quietly makes complicated things look simple, and along the way, builds a business that others want to be part of.

Her success isn't loud, but it's undeniable. Built not on flash, but on faith, follow-through, and a life lived with intention.







The story of young George admitting that he had chopped down one of his father's prize cherry trees is a myth from Mason Locke Weems' biography, The Life of Washington (5th Edition, published in 1806). Weems created the myth to illustrate how Washington's personal virtues of honesty and integrity impacted his accomplishments as both a general and a president. Weems sought to make those virtues part of the enduring role model set by the "Father of His Country."

"Truth will ultimately prevail where pains is [sic] taken to bring it to light."

Washington was born on Friday, February 22, 1732, in Westmoreland County, Virgin-

ia. Details regarding his childhood are limited. As a child, he lived at several of the properties owned by his family, one of which was Mount Vernon. His formal education was brief, but he read extensively and engaged

in self-directed learning throughout his life. Following his father's death when George was 11, his older half-brother, Lawrence, assumed a major role in his life.

At age 17, Washington became a surveyor in Culpeper County, VA, where he developed an appreciation for the land and the westward development of the American Colonies. In 1752, he began his military career as an officer in the Virginia Militia. His service during the French & Indian War provided military experience and an awareness of the changing political climate in the American Colonies.

George's marriage to Martha Dandridge Custis in 1759 was a loving and supportive union that lasted 41 years. He was an active source of guidance and support for Martha's two children. In 1761, the Washingtons inherited Mount Vernon. They managed and improved their 18th century estate, making it their permanent home along the Potomac

As tensions between Great Britain and the American Colonies grew between 1765 and 1775, Washington, who served in the Virginia House of Burgesses, was a respected voice of reason and

following the April 19, 1775 battles at Lexington and Concord, Congress named Washington Commander-in-Chief of the Continental Army. From that point through to the end of the war, he maintained an all but constant presence with the army.

During the winter of 1777-78, Washington was the central figure in the transformation of the. army from civilian volunteers to soldiers. Valley Forge is considered by many to be the birthplace of the modern United States Army. Even though the Continental Army suffered more losses than victories, American independence was ultimately secured. Following the signing of the Treaty of Paris in 1783, Washington resigned his commission. He returned to civilian life at Mount Vernon, surrendering all power and authority.

The Constitutional Convention opened in Philadelphia in May of 1787, and it ended on September 17, 1787. Washington, a delegate from Virginia, was elected president of that convention. In June of 1788, the Constitution was ratified as the new framework of government for the United States of America.

calm. In June of 1775, Following his unanimous election by the Electoral College, Washington was inaugurated as the first President of the United States, in New York City, on April 30, 1789. He was unanimously re-elected in 1792. He remains the only president unanimously elected by the Electoral College.

> As the first president, Washington, breathed life into the executive branch of the new government. He established precedents where none existed. Most notably, he established the president's cabinet, executive privilege to protect sensitive information, various social and diplomatic roles of the president, the peaceful transfer of power from one president to the next, and the simple title "Mr. President." By refusing a third term, he established an informal limit that continued until the 1940 and 1944 re-elections of Franklin Roosevelt to a third and fourth term. In 1951, the Twenty-Second Amendment to the Constitution formalized Washington's two-term limit.

Throughout his many years of service, Washington did not blur the lines between his public life and his personal life. As a result, he avoided potential abuses of the

powers entrusted to him. He had made himself accessible when his country called on him, and when his service was over, he relinquished all power and returned to the quiet life of a farmer at Mount Vernon. The Roman leader Cincinnatus (c. 519 – c. 430 BC) demonstrated that same model. Because of the similarities in their commitment to service followed by a peaceful surrendering of power, Washington is often referred to as the "American Cincinnatus."

On December 14, 1799, Washington died of complications from a throat infection. He is buried at Mount Vernon. Although many eulogies were offered, what may well be the most memorable was shared on December 26, 1799 in Philadelphia. It was offered by Henry "Light-Horse Harry" Lee, a member of Congress who had served with Washington during the Revolutionary War. Lee summed up the enduring relationship between George Washington and his fellow countrypersons when he declared that he was "First in war, first in peace, and first in the hearts of his countrymen."


