# **High Performance Diesels** with Bruce Mallinson

When the emission system is working correctly, removing it is unnecessary. If the shop you are using cannot repair the emissions, find an intelligent shop that understands the system. call the dealer nearest to you and ask them. However, problems such as faulty sensors, an SCR at the end of its useful life, or a broken wire harness can happen. Any emissions problem can be fixed at our facility, and your truck can be kept legal and powerful with an extended engine life and excellent fuel mile-



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age. I know several great service managers at dealerships that will be able to help you with emission problems. Do yourself a favor, continue running the Max Mileage Catalyst, eliminate 90 percent of the problems, and enjoy the benefits of a clean engine.

Just today, I received a call from an older owner-operator from California who should have known better than to have his truck deleted. It's a 389 Pete, 485 ISX with 800,000 miles. The engine runs well; however, there were some mechanical issues with the emissions system, and the mechanics needed to be educated on the internal workings of the emission system. So, they deleted his system and improperly set the ECM. The result was very high turbo boost on the level, poor fuel mileage, and low power. At 62 mph on the level, the boost is 21 psi; in direct gear, at 52 mph, the turbo boost is 18 psi. It should be between 0 to 2 psi. This engine is wearing itself out because the mechanic did NOT know how to set the variable geometry turbo. Can Pittsburgh Power make the changes to his ECM? Of course, we can. However, our number will show we were the last shop in the ECM, and now we are associated with an illegal truck, and WE WILL NOT DO THAT. Fines of \$1,000,000.00 and time in jail could be the result. Getting good, reputable shops to work on your truck is only one of the detrimental issues you will face with a injection, poor air mixing, deleted truck.

the Cummins in our shop that has all its emissions systems restored from a bad delete scenario. Because the parts have been off for so long, many of them, like the EGR, must be replaced. A new wiring harness and many sensors were also needed. Even after all the parts were replaced, multiple codes still exist, and our engineering team is working hard to find all of the potential faults that are still inherent in this kind of repair. This can get costly. Another reason to think twice before deleting.

Why Diesel Engines Are Chronic Smokers

Diesel engines are wellknown for their strength and effectiveness, especially in heavy-duty tasks like powering trucks, buses, and industrial machines. However, one common issue with diesel engines is their tendency to produce more smoke than gasoline or alternative fuel engines. Understanding why diesel engines emit more smoke can help clarify how they work and why they emit pollutants.

One key reason for diesel engine smoke is the type of fuel they use. Diesel fuel is thicker and oilier than gasoline, made up of larger molecules. When these molecules are injected into the engine's combustion chamber, they're supposed to break down into smaller droplets for a more efficient burn. However, this process can sometimes fail to be completed due to factors like insufficient fuel or imperfect combustion particles.

Another reason is that diesel engines operate at higher compression ratios than other engines. This compression generates more heat, which is crucial for igniting the denser diesel fuel without spark plugs. But this intense heat can also produce nitrogen oxides (NOx) and particulate matter, which are components of diesel exhaust emissions. These pollutants not only cause visible smoke but also pose environmental and health risks.

Diesel engines often use turbochargers or superchargers to boost performance by increasing air intake and combustion efficiency. While these enhance engine power, they can also increase smoke production if not appropriately matched with the engine. An oversized or mismatched turbocharger or supercharger may cause excess fuel to be injected into the combustion chamber, resulting in black smoke emissions

Additionally, the age and condition of a diesel engine affect smoke production. Older engines or those with worn components may burn fuel less efficiently, leading to more smoke. Regular maintenance and tuning are crucial to reduce smoke and ensure optimal engine performance.

Simply put, diesel engines have the tendency to produce more smoke due to the characteristics of the diesel fuel itself, high compression ratios, turbocharging effects, and engine age and condition. While advances in engine technology and emissions control have reduced diesel smoke emissions, addressing these factors is vital for minimizing environmental impact and maximizing efficiency in diesel-powered vehicles and machinery.

Parts and Labor Costs Rose in the Third Ouarter of 2023

#### **ATA Truck** Tonnage Index Increased 2.1% in December

Washington, DC... American Trucking Associations' advanced seasonally adjusted For-Hire Truck Tonnage Index increased 2.1% in December after falling 1.4% in November. In December, the index equaled 115.7 (2015=100) compared with 113.3 in November.

"While 2023 ended on a better note, truck tonnage remained in a recession as it continued to fall on a vear-over-vear basis." said ATA Chief Economist Bob Costello. "With that said, for-hire contract freight, which is what comprises our index, in December was 2.6% above the trough in April. For the entire year, tonnage contracted 1.7% from 2022 levels. This makes 2023 the worst annual reading since 2020 when the index fell 4% from 2019, and the only year since 2020 that tonnage contracted."

November's decline was revised down slightly from our December 19 press release.

Compared with December 2022, the SA index fell 0.5%, which was the tenth straight year-over-year decrease, albeit the smallest over that period. In November, the index was down 1.6% from a year earlier.

The not seasonally adjusted index, which represents the change in tonnage actually hauled by the fleets before any seasonal adjustment, equaled 110.7 in December, 1.9% below the November's level (112.8). In calculating the index, 100 represents 2015. ATA's For-Hire Truck Tonnage Index is dominated by contract freight as opposed to spot market freight.

Trucking serves as a barometer of the U.S. econ-

Washington , DC... The American Trucking Associations' Technology & Maintenance Council and Decisiv Inc. said that parts and labor expenses rose 1.9% during the third quarter of 2023, according to data released in the latest Decisiv/TMC North American Service Event Benchmark Report.

"This return to increasing parts and labor costs highlights the fact that fleets must remain vigilant when it comes to managing their maintenance expense data," said TMC Executive Director Robert Braswell. "This important parts and labor cost analysis report is an excellent tool to help Council members see how their operations are performing and plan accordingly."

The increase follows a 1.3% decline in the second quarter across the top 25 Vehicle Maintenance Reporting System Level Codes. The jump in costs reflect an equal rise in parts and labor expenses -

both of which rose 1.9% individually during the third quarter. On a year-over-year basis, parts costs are up 0.9% and labor costs rose 4.9% for a total combined increase of 2.5%.

Detailed data from Decisiv on quarter-over-quarter combined parts and labor costs indicated increases in 18 of the 25 VMRS System Codes. Year-overyear, parts and labor cost increases were seen in 22 VMRS System Codes. The data on 25 VMRS System Level Codes accounts for more than 97% of total parts and labor costs for more than seven million assets and over 300,000 monthly maintenance and repair events at more than 5,000 service locations.

Considering that truck tonnage and consequently mileage continue to decline, the likely explanation for higher parts costs is the impact of ongoing inflationary pressures. In September, the American Trucking Associations' seasonally adjusted ForHire Truck Tonnage Index decreased 1.1% compared to the previous month and was down 4.1% year-overvear, the seventh straight annual decrease and the largest over that period. In the same month, ATA's not seasonally adjusted index, which represents the change in freight tonnage actually hauled by fleets, was 6.8% below August.

The labor costs side of the equation is equally challenged, driven in large part by the ongoing technician shortage affecting dealers and fleets. Based on data from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, the costs associated with technician recruitment will not see any relief for the foreseeable future, with a projected need of about 23,900 heavy vehicle and mobile equipment service technicians each year on average over the next decade.

"Despite running fewer miles to handle lower freight volumes and the influx of less repair intensive new trucks, fleets and service providers are still

challenged by inflationary cost pressures on parts prices and higher labor costs," said Decisiv President and CEO Dick Hyatt. "The data in this report, however, enables everyone in the service supply chain to anticipate and focus on areas where cost control measures will prove most valuable."

The Decisiv/TMC North American Service Event Benchmark Reports are generated using data from the Decisiv SRM platform on service and repair events for more than 7 million commercial assets operating across the U.S. and Canada. The industry's largest asset service management system is being used to manage a weekly average of 70,000 service events at nearly 5,000 locations.

Technology ATA's & Maintenance Council issues the reports to its fleet members. The reports are organized based on the Council's Vehicle Maintenance Reporting Standards sorted by VMRS-coded vehicle systems and geographic location.

#### Intermodal **Stands Out** in Fourth Quarter

CALVERTON, MD... Total intermodal volumes gained 3.1 percent yearover-year in the fourth quarter of 2023, according to the Intermodal Association of North America. While trailers dropped 21.6 percent, domestic container and international container originations grew 6.0 percent and 2.9 percent, respectively. It was the first of the past nine quarters showing year-over-year growth.

«The fourth quarter may have been an point inflection for intermodal. Both trade flows and inventories started to swing in its favor," said Joni Casey, president and CEO of IANA. "Monetary actions by the Federal Reserve to bring down interest rates in 2024 could further set the industry up for more sustainable growth.»

All but one of the seven highest-density trade corridors, which collectively handled more than 60 percent of total volume, were up in the fourth quarter. The South Central-Southwest corridor was up 9.6 percent, while the Southeast-Southwest climbed 8.7 percent, and the intra-Southeast added 6.3 percent. The Midwest-Southwest and Midwest-Northwest both gained 4.8 percent, and Northeast-Midwest the put on 4.6 percent. The Trans-Canada was the only loss at 2.3 percent.

Total IMC volume fell 11.8 percent year-overyear in Q4, with intermodal down 6.6 percent and highway traffic down 14.9 percent.

**IANA's** roster of corporate members includes railroads, ocean



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omy, representing 72.6% of tonnage carried by all modes of domestic freight transportation, including manufactured and retail goods. Trucks hauled 11.46 billion tons of freight in 2022. Motor carriers collected \$940.8 billion, or 80.7% of total revenue earned by all transport modes.

ATA calculates the tonnage index based on surveys from its membership and has been doing so since the 1970s. This is a preliminary figure and subject to change in the final report issued around the 5th day of each month. The report includes month-tomonth and year-over-year results, relevant economic comparisons, and key financial indicators.

Truck **Parking On Interstate 5** Will Be Safer And **Easier Thanks To New Grant-Funded** Project

Truck drivers traveling Interstate 5 will have an easier and safer experience finding truck parking, thanks to an innovative new project and federal grant funding.

Oregon, Washington and California were recently awarded \$12.3 million in federal grant funds for their joint Regional Truck Parking Information Management System project. The project will deploy a real-time truck parking information system at 54 truck parking areas along I-5 through all three states.

The grant funds come from the federal INFRA grant program. Oregon, Washington, and California will split the awarded funds to deploy the system at truck parking areas in their states, creating a connected system the length of I-5.

We expect the project to kick off in late 2024 or early 2025 with initial planning and outreach to trucking groups and other communities. The project should be complete and serving truckers in 2027.

#### **Something To Think About - What Can I Do Now?**

She was a kind and generous person. She became a nurse when that was the only real option for girls wanting to go into the medical field. That was unless they had some legacy connection to the profession though a family member. There was no doubt that she had learned a great deal during her 40-plus years as an emergency room and surgical scrub nurse.

During her career, the changes that had come to the field of nursing were as life-altering as they were numerous. Continual training and constant updates were required. She never missed an opportunity to learn, experience, and grow in her craft. It was obvious that she was committed to that process. She knew it was the only way she could be at her best.

The interplay between modern medicine and basic human nature seemed to fascinate her. She recognized the role of the patient in medicine and she appreciated it. At a church social, she once shared a story that demonstrated unmistakably just how impactful that role could be.

She was committed to her church and the parishioners with whom she shared it. She organized and really supported a so-

cial group that got together on Saturday evenings several times each year. There was no set schedule, but instead, she just seemed to keep it going on a random calendar, that brought the group together at various locations. It was a social time, with good food, good company, and good conversation. One meeting may be a hayride on one of the member's farm, and the next could be a simple gathering in the basement of the church.

There was always food, and more often than not, she provided a substantial portion of it. And if you were lucky, it included her shrimp dip. At these gatherings, the conversation always seemed to develop organically. There was no set topic, but every time you attended, you walked away having learned something. You were a bit more aware of life and happy that you had been there.

At one of these gatherings, she casually shared a particularly powerful story. She mentioned no names and she talked in general terms. Instead of being a recollection of a specific event, this tale seemed to be a generic story of something she had witnessed numerous times. She started by sharing that everyone responds differently when they find them-

selves in an emergency situation, and their response can make all the difference in how they work through it. It became quickly evident that this story was anything but casual in its potential impact.

She spoke about two patients admitted to the emergency room, both being in the harsh throes of potentially life-threatening circumstances. Their ages were similar, and their general health was also about the same. She said that as she interacted with them throughout the night, she uttered a prayer for each of them, as she always did.

As the group sat down to enjoy their food in that church basement, she continued with her story. One guy in that group was really paying attention. He'd recently made a trip to the ER, and the experiences had left him a little anxious. She was talking to the group, but he hung on her every word.

She went on to say that both patients were stabilized, then admitted. They'd each require continued treatment and surgical procedures, followed by recovery and rehabilitation. She stressed their similar physical conditions and their projected courses of recovery. She then pointed out that that's where their similarities ended. Their views of the roles they'd play in what came next in their lives was noticeably, even strikingly, different. One of them asked again and again in an aggravated tone, "Why did this happen to me," and "What's being done for me?" The other asked, "What did I do to cause this?" and "What can I do now?"

Again, the little group fell quiet. That is other than the sounds of spoons lightly clanging against bowls of chili. She provided the chili, and the warm bread, then garnished it with a fascinating life lesson! The guy who was listening so intently then asked, "How'd they make out?"

"Oh, they both made it, but they made it quite differently. One came back stronger—recommitted to life. The other one, well, not so much. I'll leave it up to you to determine which was which!"

By accepting a fuller measure of personal responsibility, we can help to determine what does and doesn't happen in our lives. We can help to set our course through tough times, and as a result we may well emerge better prepared for opportunities that always seem to follow on the heels of difficult circumstances.

#### **ATA Welcomes More Than \$200 Million** for Truck Parking Projects

Washington, DC... American Trucking Associations welcomed five major new federal investments by the Department of Transportation that will add approximately 1,000 truck parking spaces and make it easier for drivers to locate parking along key freight corridors in Florida, Missouri, Pennsylvania, California, Oregon, Washington and Wisconsin.

The funding stems from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and was allocated through the Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (IN-FRA) Program. Combined

with previous awards to

Florida, Texas, Tennessee, Louisiana, Wyoming and Iowa, the announcement brings the total number of truck parking projects supported by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to 11, encompassing roughly 2,000 additional spaces.

The new awards follow ATA's effort to urge governors to request Bipartisan Infrastructure Law funding for truck parking projects in their states.

The INFRA funding was awarded as follows:

\* \$180,009,420 for 917 spaces at four locations on I-4 in central Florida.

\* \$92,883,609 for improvements to I-70 in Missouri, which will include new parking capacity.

\* \$40,798,046 for a project at Lehigh Valley International Airport in Pennsylvania, which will include the creation of a safe truck parking area as an alternative to the current practice of parking off-site in unauthorized locations nearby.

\* \$12,287,247 for a joint California, Oregon and Washington I-5 Truck Parking Information Management System that will provide real-time information.

\$8,000,000 to add 54 spaces on I-90 in Wisconsin as well as realtime information system technology.

I run this route only a few times each year, and for the most part, it's a predictable load. It's a scenic trip, even when the Flint Hills are on fire, and traffic is limited to road-weary families, FedEx triples, drug-running entrepreneurs, and mail haulers like me. It's a great time for personal reflection, corporate gratitude, and genuine appreciation for cruise conol.

It's a time to embrace mental health, goodwill to men, and remembering how good-looking my wife is. Life is good, some nights, and nobody knows it better than me. Especially at 3:00 AM, when I'm just hitting the interstate, it's a comfort zone for a mostly awake truck driver.

That is, until I reach mile marker 100.1 north of Cassoday. By this time, I'm in that zone where one is groovin' to the music, glancing at the moon, and counting the money that's sure to roll in someday. But as I've done countless times on this run, I forget about the bridge. The evil bridge. The bridge that's

about to ruin the reputation I always wanted.

Chaplains provide care and biblical counseling for those who cannot bear their burdens alone and who need a trusted and objective friend and confidant. Very few companies realize the transformation a chaplaincy program can bring to their company. Where can you find a chaplaincy program specifically designed for the trucking community? ### **CVSA's International Roadcheck Is Scheduled for May 14-16**

Washington, DC... The Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance's (CVSA) International Roadcheck is scheduled for May 14-16. International Roadcheck is a high-visibility, high-volume commercial motor vehicle inspection and regulatory compliance enforcement initiative that takes place over three days in Canada, Mexico and the United States.

CVSA-certified law enforcement personnel will inspect commercial motor vehicles and drivers at weigh/inspection stations, temporary sites and mobile patrols to verify compliance federal, state, with provincial or territorial regulations. Data from the 72 hours of International Roadcheck will be collected and the results will be released this summer.

Over the three days of International Roadcheck, inspectors will conduct their routine North American Standard Level I Inspection, which is a thorough 37-step inspection procedure consisting of the examination of vehicle components and driver documentation and requirements.

During the vehicle portion of the Level I Inspection, inspectors will ensure the vehicle's brake systems, cargo securement. coupling devices, driveline/ driveshaft components, driver's seat, fuel and exhaust systems, frames, lighting devices, steering mechanisms, suspensions, tires, wheels, rims, hubs, and windshield wipers are compliant with regulations. In addition, inspections of motorcoaches, passenger vans and other passengercarrying vehicles will also include the examination of emergency exits, seating, and electrical cables and systems in the engine and battery compartments.

A vehicle that successfully passes a Level I or V Inspection without any critical vehicle inspection item violations may receive a CVSA decal, which is valid for three months. If out-of-service violations, as outlined in the North American Standard Out-of-Service Criteria, are found during an inspection, the vehicle will be restricted from operating until all out-ofservice violations have been properly addressed.

During the driver portion of an inspection, inspectors will check the driver's operating credentials, hours-of-service documentation, DACH status (in the U.S.), seat belt usage, and for alcohol and/or drug impairment.

If an inspector identifies driver out-ofservice violations, such as not possessing a valid or necessary operating license or exhibiting signs of impairment, the inspector will restrict that driver from operating their vehicle.

For International Roadcheck, in case of inclement weather or other limiting circumstances, instead of a Level I Inspection, a jurisdiction or an inspector may opt to conduct a Level II Walk-Around Driver/Vehicle Inspection or Level III Driver/Credential/Administrative Inspection, neither of which are eligible for a CVSA decal.
